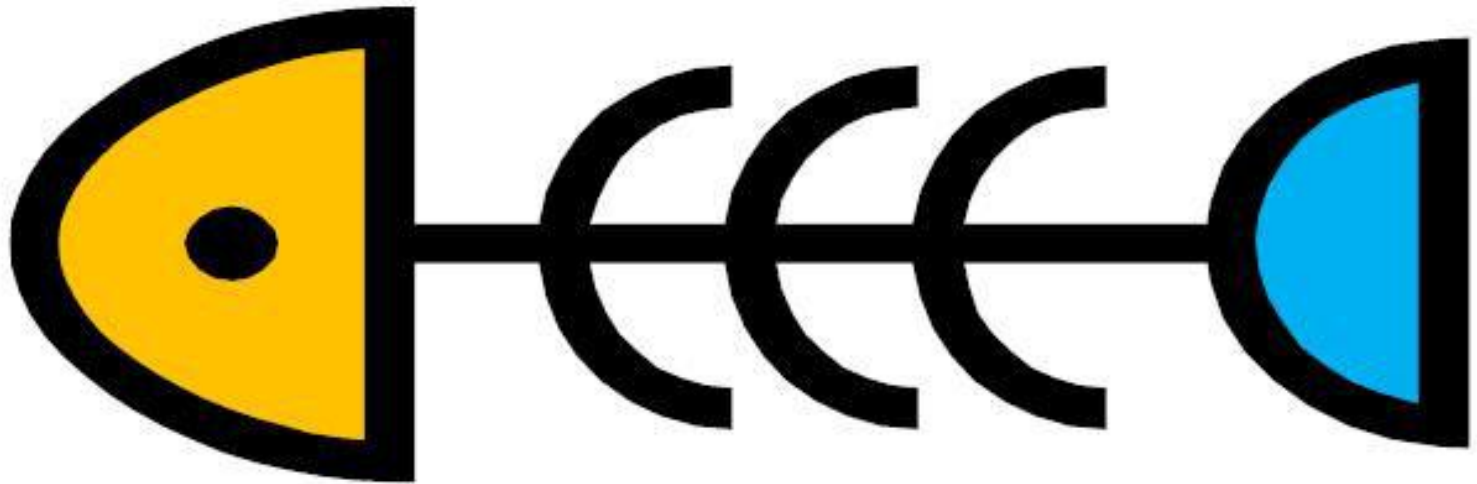

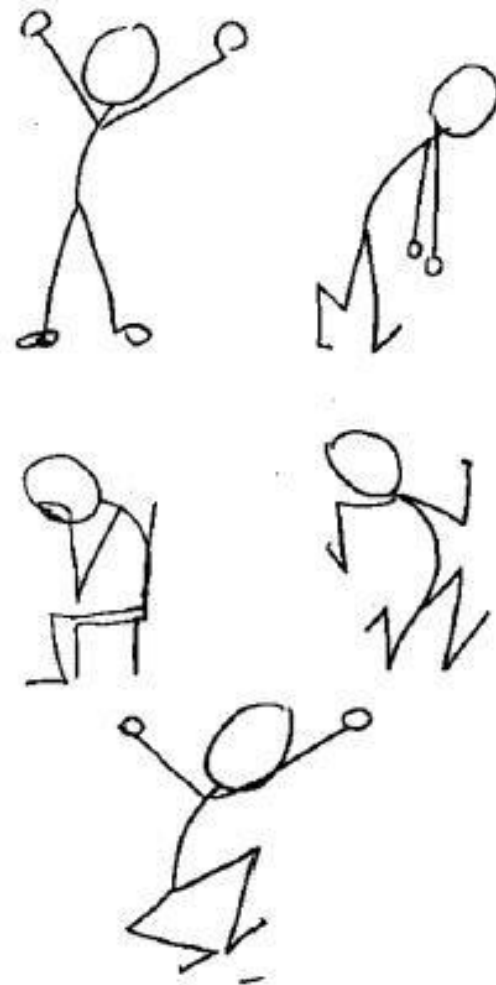

- Eliminate jargon and unnecessary words. Use correct grammar.

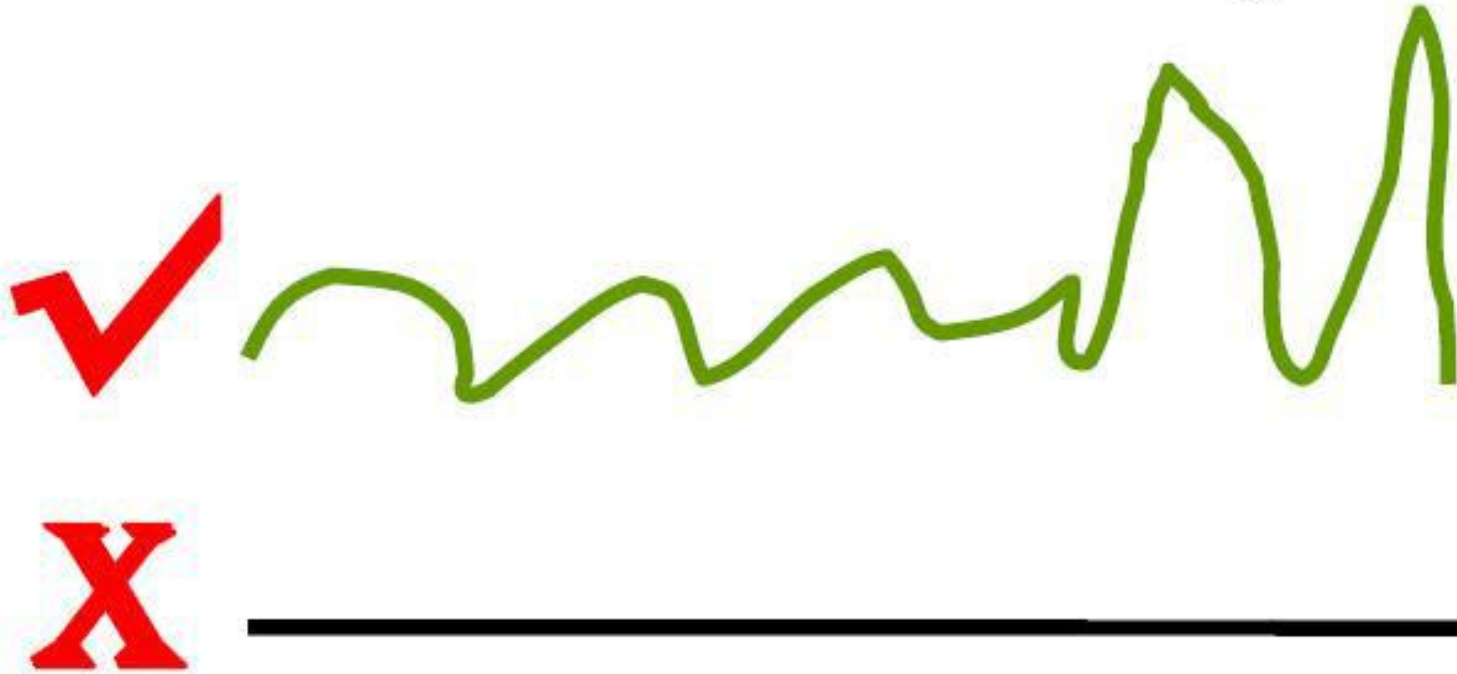
P5 Your Body Speaks

P6 Vocal Variety

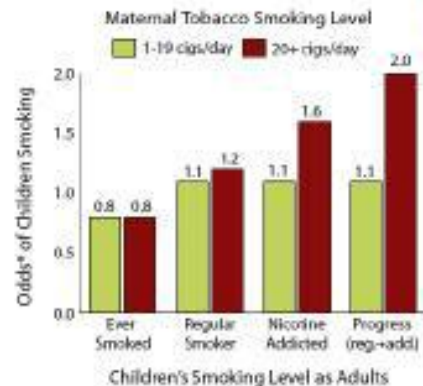


Objectives:
